INSTITUTIONAL MILESTONES

STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND SCHOOL GOVERNANCE

- **School Elections – 21 April 2025**

School elections were conducted for **Grades 4 to 9**. Two student parties, **United Student Party** and **Students Rising Party**, contested in the elections. The **Students Rising Party** secured victory with a higher number of elected MPs and MLAs.

A **debate between two parties** was also conducted at **Indraprastha Mahal**, with alumnus **Mr. Baladharshan, MBA**, serving as guest and judge.

- **Swearing-in Ceremony – 25 April 2025**

The Swearing-in Ceremony for the elected representatives of the **Nachiar Government 2025–2026** was held with **Mr. Rishi Roshan, Deputy Director, Tamil Nadu State Judicial Academy, Regional Centre, Coimbatore**, as the Chief Guest.

- **In-house Training Programme – 12 May 2025 to 14 May 2025**

An in-house teachers' training programme was conducted on **NEP 2020, strengthening assessment and evaluation practices, and classroom management**. The sessions were led by **Mr. Sathish Kumar, CEO, CS Academy, Erode**.

The programme focused on aligning classroom practices with the National Education Policy, strengthening effective assessment methods, and enhancing classroom management strategies for meaningful learning outcomes.

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- **CBP Programme – Critical and Creative Thinking – 23 May 2025 and 24 May 2025**

A **Capacity Building Programme (CBP)** on **Critical and Creative Thinking** was organised for teachers.

The programme focused on developing innovative teaching approaches, reflective classroom practices, and strategies to promote higher-order thinking skills among students.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT AND EDUCATIONAL EXPOSURE

Archaeological Learning Visit – 24 April 2025

Prior to the field visit, **Mrs. Kavya, Archaeologist**, conducted an orientation session for **Grades 6 to 9** on excavation methods and archaeological processes. Students later visited the **archaeological site at Kongalnagaram, Pollachi**.

- **Parent Orientation Programme – 21 June 2025**

A **Parent Orientation Programme** was conducted to familiarise parents with **NEP 2020**, the school's functioning, and the effective use of the school application. The session helped strengthen communication and partnership between the school and parents.

- **Lunch Circle – Career Guidance Initiative**

The **Lunch Circle Career Guidance Initiative** commenced on **21 July 2025 onwards**.

As part of this initiative, **resource persons from various professional sectors**, including **many of our alumni and local industrialists**, interacted with senior students. They guided students on **emerging career sectors, higher education opportunities, skill development, and pathways for future academic pursuits**.

- **Book Festival Visit – 26 July 2025**

Students visited the **Book Festival** to develop reading habits and broaden their literary exposure. The visit provided an opportunity to explore a wide range of books and encouraged interest in reading and learning.

Educational Trip – Regional Science Centre, Coimbatore – 3 August 2025

A total of **122 students from Grades 6 to 12** participated in the educational visit. The trip provided hands-on learning experiences and helped students explore scientific concepts, innovation, and practical applications beyond the classroom.

- **DJ Photography Contest – 3 August 2025**

A total of **122 students from Grades 6 to 12**, accompanied by **4 teachers**, participated in the photography event. The visit provided students with exposure to photography as an art form and helped them appreciate creativity, visual storytelling, and artistic expression.

- **Photo Exhibition at School Campus**

Following the **DJ Photography Contest**, the photography exhibition was displayed on the school campus. Students from our school and neighbouring schools had the opportunity to view world-class photographs free of cost. It was a unique initiative and one of the first such photography exhibitions held in **Pollachi**, providing wider artistic exposure to young learners.

INDUSTRIAL VISIT

- **Industrial Visit – Grades 4 and 5**

Students of **Grades 4 and 5** visited **Umesh Pencil Processors, Singanallur, and Sai Coirs, Nanjegoundenpudhur**. A total of **71 students**, accompanied by **4 teachers**, participated in the visit. The programme provided practical exposure to manufacturing processes and helped students understand how raw materials are transformed into useful products.

- **Gass Forest Museum and Botanical Garden Visit – 3 August 2025**

Students of **Grades 1 to 3** visited the **Gass Forest Museum, Coimbatore, and the Botanical Garden, Coimbatore**. The visit provided young learners with an opportunity to observe nature, biodiversity, and plant life, enriching their learning through direct experience beyond the classroom

STUDENT WELL-BEING, HEALTH AND AWARENESS PROGRAMMES

- **Care and Comfort Wear – A Growing Girls Talk – 19 April 2025**

Ms. Ponmani from Naidu Hall addressed girls of **Grades 6 to 12** along with their mothers on personal health, hygiene, comfort, adolescence, and self-confidence.

- **Drug-Free Tamil Nadu Week – 23 June 2025 to 27 June 2025**

The week was observed through assemblies, speeches, and drama presentations.

- **Drug Awareness Programme – 5 July 2025**

Mrs. Vishnu Priya Perumal, Psychologist, Lotus Rehabilitation Centre, Zamin Uthukuli, addressed students of **Grades 4 to 12** on the theme **"Say No to Addiction."**

- **Sugar Awareness Programme – 5 July 2025**

The school conducted a **Sugar Awareness Programme** with **Dr. Jayabalaji, Physician, JB Clinic, Pollachi**, as the guest speaker. He addressed students on healthy food habits, balanced nutrition, and the importance of reducing excessive sugar intake for a healthy lifestyle.

An eye camp was organised by **The Eye Foundation** for students from **Kindergarten to Grade 12**. Referral cards were issued where required.
